Now in its ninth year, the Africa Tax Symposium has established a reputation for high quality discussions from a rich field of acclaimed speakers. Attendees at the Africa Tax Symposium come from all over Africa, representing a global network of tax professionals and thought leaders.

The ninth Africa Tax Symposium takes place in Nairobi, Kenya, from 29 to 31 May 2024.

The theme of the Africa Tax Symposium is the same from year to year: 'Trends in International Taxation - An African Perspective'.

This evergreen theme encompasses the latest developments in the field of international tax, as well as the practical challenges faced by Governments and taxpayers in the application of domestic law and tax treaties. The theme also covers tax-related issues arising in related fields, such as in the areas of trade and investment. In addition, the theme encompasses broader issues such as domestic resource mobilisation, and global tax governance.

This year's Symposium offers rich discussions on the following sub-themes:

- Current multilateral developments (including initiatives by the OECD Inclusive Framework and the UN), and their impact on Africa.
- The implementation of the Global Minimum Tax, and its impact on African governments, businesses, and consumers;
- Tax issues arising from cross-border trade, with particular emphasis on tax treaties, transfer pricing, and VAT;
- Tax-related issues in the fields of trade and investment;
- Tax administration in Africa past, present, and future;
- Domestic resource mobilisation challenges, successes, and prospects;
- Global tax governance, and the potential for more meaningful African engagement.

In line with our Symposium's tradition, we will hold a special session, the 'Host Country Focus'. This session focuses on a pertinent issue of great relevance to the host country for the Symposium. This year's Host Country Focus will centre on effective dispute resolution in Kenya.
